### **Questions and Preparation**

- Is WordPress the right choice?
- Should we modify an existing theme or build a custom design?
- Are there any major considerations, such as e-commerce or membership?
- Where will the site be hosted?
- Who will maintain the site?
- Get an idea of the design and functionality needed
- Get content to add (text, images, etc.)
- Get hosting account and SFTP access
- Tell site owner to hold off on making changes (if it's an existing website)

#### Site Setup

- Create new installation (or a staging site, if it's an existing website)
- Make sure search engine visibility is off, password protection on (optional)
- Upload theme(s) and plugins via SFTP
- Activate theme and plugins
- Add license keys
- Upgrade if necessary
- Import saved plugin settings
- Configure plugins (SEO, forms, backups, etc)

### Design and Customization

- Add content
- Import design template and CSS snippets
- Customize the design
- Test mobile responsive design, different browsers, forms, and other behavior
- Go through approval process with client

## Going Live

- Turn off password protection, turn on search engine visibility
- Set up SSL
- If using a staging site, copy design and new content over to live site manually (don't push staging to live)
- If using a new host, change DNS records
- Clear the cache

#### Theme

- Genesis is a premium theme framework by <u>StudioPress</u> (owned by WP Engine)
- <u>Dynamik</u> is a premium child theme for Genesis

- <u>Advanced Custom Fields</u> (premium, but they have a free version)
  - Complex or structured layouts
- <u>Antispam Bee</u>
  - Reduce comment spam, better than Akismet
- <u>ARVE Advanced Responsive Video Embedder</u>
  - Responsive video embeds with a shortcode
- <u>Beaver Builder</u> (premium, but they have a free version)
  - Page builder
- <u>Better Search Replace</u>
  - Serialized search and replace in database

- Black Studio TinyMCE Widget
  - More advanced visual editor widget
- Blubrry PowerPress
  - Podcasts
- <u>Classic Editor</u>
  - Disables Gutenberg
- Custom Post Type UI
  - For different data types
- Disqus Comment System
  - Separately hosted comment system, better engagement

- <u>Display Posts</u>
  - Display lists of posts in a configurable shortcode
- <u>Duplicate Post</u>
  - Fully copies pages and posts
- <u>Genesis Simple Edits</u>
  - Tweaks for Genesis themes
- <u>Google Analytics Dashboard for WP</u>
  - GA with additional options
- <u>Google Analytics for WordPress by MonsterInsights</u>
  - GA with additional options

- <u>Gravity Forms</u> (premium)
  - Reliable forms with many configuration options
- <u>Paid Memberships Pro</u> (premium, but they have a free version)
  - Memberships
- <u>Post Snippets</u>
  - Repeat content with a shortcode, embed code within a page
- <u>Redirection</u>
  - Advanced redirects
- <u>Related Posts for WordPress</u>
  - Automatically show related posts at the bottom of your posts

## **Common Plugins**

- <u>ShortPixel Image Optimizer</u>
  - Image optimization
- <u>Simple 301 Redirects</u>
  - Easy redirects, including basic wildcard redirects
- <u>Simple Custom CSS</u>
  - Add custom CSS without editing theme files
- <u>Simple Social Icons</u>
  - Simple icons linking to common social profiles
- Table of Contents Plus
  - Generate a table of contents on your long pages

#### • <u>TinyMCE Advanced</u>

- Adds buttons to the WordPress editor
- <u>UpdraftPlus</u> (premium, but they have a free version)
  - Backup/restore plugin
- <u>WP101</u> (premium)
  - Basic tutorial videos accessible from backend
- <u>WP Rocket</u> (premium)
  - Speed optimization
- Yoast SEO
  - The most popular SEO plugin

#### Software

- <u>Evernote</u> (premium, but they have a free version)
  - Keep CSS, JS, PHP, SQL, .htaccess code snippets, SOPs, license keys
- <u>LastPass</u> (premium, but they have a free version)
  - Password management
- <u>Sublime Text</u> (free, with occasional nag to purchase)
  - Text editor with color coding, different color themes, advanced features
- <u>Transmit</u> (premium, for macOS only)
  - A faster FTP/SFTP program than <u>FileZilla</u>, <u>Cyberduck</u>, etc.
  - Also connects to Amazon S3, Dropbox, etc.

#### Services

- <u>Amazon S3</u> (premium)
  - Get cheap backup storage (my usage: ~800GB for ~\$10/mo)
- <u>GitHub</u> (premium, but they have a free version)
  - Use version control
- <u>Google Analytics</u> (free)
  - Get advanced site traffic analytics
- <u>Google Search Console</u> (free)
  - Monitor Google indexing/crawling issues
- <u>GTMetrix</u> (free)
  - Check and monitor site speed

#### Services

- <u>Uptime Robot</u> (free)
  - Monitor uptime for up to 50 sites
- <u>WebPageTest</u> (free)
  - Check site speed
- <u>What's My DNS</u> (free)
  - Check DNS propagation
- <u>Why No Padlock?</u> (free)
  - Check for SSL errors

#### **Best Practices**

- Always get hosting account and SFTP access before editing a site, in case something breaks
- Use staging sites for new designs, never push staging to live
- Keep search engine visibility off if demo content is accessible, or if the site is not ready to be indexed yet
- Set up SSL as soon as possible, 301 redirect http to https
- Use GitHub for sites with significant development customizations

## Time Saving Techniques

- Use the same themes and plugins, and get really good with them
- Write down procedures, copy down code you might reuse later
- Use a spreadsheet to keep track of upgrade dates, WP versions, PHP versions
- Browser bookmarks for logins and pages to test after upgrading
  - 2 copies of each bookmark
- Load themes and plugins via SFTP instead of manually installing
- Export general and design settings in Dynamik, forms in Gravity Forms, etc.
